Installation Instructions

Please read BOTH these Installation Instructions and the General Towing Instructions before attempting to install or operate this equipment.

- Blue Ox® towing products and accessories are intended to be installed by Blue Ox® Dealers who are familiar with our products and have the equipment and knowledge to do "fit work." When necessary, Blue Ox® Dealers can be found at www.blueox.com or by contacting our Customer Care Department at (402) 385-3051.
- 2. Many Blue Ox® baseplates are designed to use existing holes and hardware to mount the baseplate to the towed vehicle. Even though bolts are there, do not assume they are adequate for baseplate mounting. Always use hardware supplied in the hardware kit or existing hardware specified in the Baseplate Towing Installation Instructions.

Confirm the towability and pre-towing procedures for your vehicle with the owner's manual or contact the vehicle's manufacturer for specific towing procedures.

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

Important:

Use only genuine factory replacement parts on your baseplate. Do **NOT** substitute homemade or non-typical parts. If a bolt is lost or in need of replacement, for your safety and the preservation of your baseplate, be sure to use a replacement bolt of the same grade (In most cases it will be Grade 5, please reference the parts list above). Replacement parts may be ordered through your nearest Blue Ox® Dealer or Distributor. Failing to follow and/or altering these installation instructions in either installation or required equipment will void the manufacturer's warranty.

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Attachment Tabs: Due to the design of the removable tabs, the RangeFinder II, Adventurer and Ambassador tow bars can not be used. Adapters, except the BX8833 and BX88151, can be used with this baseplate.

Installation Notes: The fascia is removed and reinstalled during installation of the baseplate. Drilling is required. Trimming of the fascia is required.

The dimensional variations between otherwise identical vehicles can be considerable. While the baseplate was designed for easy installation, it may be necessary to tailor the baseplate slightly to compensate for auto manufacturer's tolerances. These minor adjustments may include filing a hole slightly, bending electrical rods or bending end plates.

The BX8869 Bulb and Socket Wiring Kit is recommended for this vehicle.

Handling of some cosmetic parts when installing this product may require the use of protective covers, rags, specialty tools, etc. to prevent damage.

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
 Using a flat screwdriver, remove 4 push pins from the flat plastic piece on top. Do this to both sides of the vehicle. Set push pins aside to be reinstalled later.

Do not use the towed vehicle for storing luggage, equipment, etc. This may cause you to exceed the towing capacity of the tow bar, baseplate, and its accessories.

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Using a phillips screwdriver, remove two
phillips screws on top of the fascia and using a
flat screwdriver, remove one pushpin from the
top outside edge. Do this to both sides of the
vehicle. Set screws and push pins aside to be
reinstalled later.





 Using a phillips screwdriver, remove four phillips screws just forward of the front tire, on the wheel well. Set screws aside to be reinstalled later. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.



 Using a phillips screwdriver, remove two screws from just forward of the front tire underneath. Set screws aside to be reinstalled later. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.

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 After removing the screws in Step 1 and 2, pull plastic back to get to a bolt. Using a 7MM socket, remove bolt and set aside to be reinstalled later. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.


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6. Using a 10MM socket, remove a bolt from the brace for the fog light. In the picture above, the bolt is hidden slightly (see white arrow). Set bolt aside to be reinstalled later. Do this to both sides of the vehicle. The fascia is then ready to be removed from the vehicle and carefully set aside to be reinstalled later.




8. Mark and cut out frame according to the photo above, using a reciprocating saw. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.





7. Using a flat screwdriver, remove pushpin (see white arrow) and then using a utility knife, cut along dashed line shown in the photo above (see grey arrow). The plastic piece will not be reinstalled and can be discarded. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.



 Using a 15MM socket, remove two bolts from the front of the bumper. Set bolts aside to be reinstalled later. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.


10. Drill a 1 1/4" hole into the frame, so the nut plates can go through. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.

When using power drills, be aware of the dangers of torque and drill bit length.

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11. Slide baseplate up, so it matches up with the existing holes of the bumper. Insert the existing bolts from the bumper and tighten them down with a 15MM socket so they are snug. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.





13. Attach permanent baseplate safety cables to the convenience link on the baseplate (see photo 12A). Photo 12B shows recommended installation of the cables to frame of vehicle. If vehicle has additional options (not shown above) which interfere with mounting permanent baseplate safety cables, secure the cables to a solid piece of the vehicle frame as described in instructions included with the permanent baseplate safety cables.



12. Using the baseplate as a template, drill the two bottom holes into the frame with a 17/32" drill bit. Insert the 1/2" nut plates into the frame and align with drilled holes. Insert a 1/2-13x1 1/2" hex bolt and 1/2" lock washer into each hole and tighten down with a 3/4" socket. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.

BE SURE TO USE LOCTITE® RED ON ALL BOLTS

14. Align the fascia to its original position, and using a hack saw knife, trim out the opening in the grille for the attachment tabs, using the photo above as a template. Do this to both sides of the vehicle.

Be sure that **ALL** electrical connections are plugged in properly and functioning **BEFORE** installing the fascia.

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Install the tow bar and safety cables according to the instructions provided in their packages. When demonstrating this to the customer, be sure to include all the contents and packages.

Do **NOT** substitute other devices if the tow bar pins and clips are misplaced.

DEALER or INSTALLER: Be certain the user receives the instruction sheets for their products.

If the baseplate is in an accident, it must be replaced. DO NOT use it again! An accident can cause unseen damage and using it again could result in more damage or serious injury. DO NOT use the baseplate if it is damaged or missing parts.

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General Information

- 1. Ensure that your product(s) are registered online at www.blueox.com. It is crucial to register your product(s) so that you may be alerted of product offerings, updates, upgrades, maintenance and safety bulletins, and/ or recalls.
- 2. It is the owner's responsibility to inspect all towing equipment for cracked welds, missing or worn parts and loose bolts before each towing trip. Be sure to use Loctite® Red on all bolts and tighten to the recommended specifications.
- 3. It is the owner's responsibility to hook up all towing equipment per manufacturer's instructions/recommendations.
- 4. Remove the attachment tabs when not in use (if applicable).

Notice To Baseplate Installer

- 1. It is YOUR responsibility to watch for:
 - Oil cooler and air conditioner lines
 - Electrical wires and hoses
 - Missing parts or attaching points on the frame
 - ** If the baseplate is improperly installed and is against a wire or hose, it could cause fluid leaks or electrical shorts some time after the actual baseplate installation.

Permanent Baseplate Safety Cable Installation

Permanent baseplate safety cables are strongly recommended when towing a vehicle with a tow bar. The principle function of the permanent baseplate safety cables is to prevent the towed vehicle from breaking loose in the event the connection between the frame of the towed vehicle and the baseplate fails or becomes disconnected. The cables must be connected from the baseplate to the frame rail or cross member of the vehicle's frame. The illustrations below show the possible arrangements recommended by Blue Ox®. Each permanent baseplate safety cable must have an adequate weight rating for the towing system. The weight rating of the two (2) cables together will not qualify.

Do not mount the permanent baseplate safety cables against wires, hoses or brake lines.

These permanent baseplate safety cables should remain installed as long as the baseplate is installed on the vehicle. Permanent baseplate safety cables are to be used in conjunction with, and NOT a replacement for legally required safety cables attaching the towed vehicle to the towing vehicle.
